Dear friends,

In this Sunday's Gospel reading, Jesus calls the Twelve to himself, they are named and sent out. This is literally what the word *apostle* means: *sent out.* 

And as we hear these words today, we too, are called to be apostles; we too are sent out. Sent out in the name of Christ to bring the Kingdom of God to birth in our own time. And Jesus tells us what the coming Kingdom of God will look like. And these are signs. The sick are cured, lepers are cleansed, devils are cast out.

Today, when we hear these signs of the coming of the Kingdom, we would tend to explain them away as a simple lack of modern medical care. So, what would be for us the signs of the inbreaking of the Kingdom of God in our world?

We might be tempted to name all sorts of things as signs of the coming Kingdom of God: an end to wars, freedom for asylum seekers, and end to poverty, the stamping out of injustice in all its forms. We cannot achieve most of these things on our own. Most of these evils in our world are even beyond the power or interest of governments to change. What is within *our* power to change is what *we* do. When *we* make space for people; when *we* gather people together and allow them to find a home; when *we* give them the chance to laugh, to cry and to be themselves, this is the Kingdom of God breaking into our world.

So, is the Kingdom of God on the grand scale stalled? Is the Kingdom of God prevented from its final victory over sin and death?

The Kingdom of God is never prevented from breaking into our world. The final victory of God's steadfast and faithful love can never be thwarted by anything. *Strong is his love for us; he is faithful forever.*

#### Australian Catholic Bishops Conference— **Voice to Parliament**

As a vote on an Indigenous Voice to Parliament nears, Australia's bishops have encouraged Catholics to read and discuss the Uluru Statement from the Heart—the document from which the Voice proposal emerged.

During their recent plenary meeting in Sydney, the bishops considered how they might assist Catholics in preparing for the referendum to enshrine the Voice to Parliament in the Constitution, with a vote due in the second half of 2023.

The bishops argued that the fact First Nations Peoples have lived in Australia for many thousands of years but their custodianship of the land isn't mentioned in the Constitution: "It is an omission which needs to be rectified...a Voice to Parliament isn't the only way to achieve that outcome, but it is the way requested by those who gathered at the historic meeting at Uluru...This could be a significant step towards a more just and equitable Australia...we want to encourage all Australians to educate themselves as well as possible concerning the proposal to establish the Voice.

The bishops call for a meaningful debate on the issue, acknowledging that 'people may, in good faith, have differing concerns and perspectives...we are an open democracy, and this is a moment to use our democratic institutions to produce a highquality debate shaped by a genuine concern to do justice and bring healing to First Nations Peoples...we ask those drafting the changes to the Constitution to work together in a spirit of Stewardship Corner cooperation, so that the proposal presented to the Australian people will appeal to a wide range of the population.'

The Australian Catholic Bishops Conference endorsed the Uluru Statement from the Heart in 2021, with the Fifth Plenary Council of Australia taking the same step last year. The bishops about our response to its key messages.

## First Reading: Exodus 19:2-6

A reading from the book of Exodus

 $You\ will\ be\ a\ kingdom\ of\ priests,\ a\ consecrated\ nation.$ 

From Rephidim the Israelites set out again; and when they reached the wilderness of Sinai, there in the wilderness they pitched their camp; there facing the mountain Israel pitched camp.

Moses then went up to God, and the Lord called to him from the mountain, saying, 'Say this to the House of Jacob, declare this to the sons of Israel, "You yourselves have seen what I did with the Egyptians, how I carried you on eagle's wings and brought you to myself. From this you know that now, if you obey my voice and hold fast to my covenant, you of all the nations shall be my very own, for all the earth is mine. I will count you a kingdom of priests, a consecrated nation."

#### **Second Reading: Romans 5:6-11**

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Romans

We have been reconciled to God through the death of his Son; we are saved by his life.

We were still helpless when at his appointed moment Christ died for sinful men. It is not easy to die even for a good man - though of course for someone really worthy, a man might be prepared to die - but what proves that God loves us is that Christ died for us while we were still sinners. Having died to make us righteous, is it likely that he would now fail to save us from God's anger? When we were reconciled to God by the death of his Son, we were still enemies; now that we have been reconciled surely we may count on being saved by the life of his Son? Not merely because we have been reconciled but because we are filled with joyful trust in God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have already gained our reconciliation.

Alleluia, alleluia! The kingdom of God is near; repent and believe the Good News! Alleluia!

#### **Gospel: Matthew 9:36 - 10:8**

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew

#### He summoned his twelve disciples, and sent them out.

When Jesus saw the crowds he felt sorry for them because they were harassed and dejected, like sheep without a shepherd. Then he said to his disciples, 'The harvest is rich but the labourers are few, so ask the Lord of the harvest to send labourers to his harvest.'

He summoned his twelve disciples, and gave them authority over unclean spirits with power to cast them out and to cure all kinds of diseases and sickness.

These are the names of the twelve apostles: first, Simon who is called Peter, and his brother Andrew; James the son of Zebedee, and his brother John; Philip and Bartholomew; Thomas, and Matthew the tax collector; James the son of Alphaeus, and Thaddaeus; Simon the Zealot and Judas Iscariot, the one who was to betray him. These twelve Jesus sent out, instructing them as follows:

'Do not turn your steps to pagan territory, and do not enter any Samaritan town; go rather to the lost sheep of the House of Israel. And as you go, proclaim that the kingdom of heaven is close at hand. Cure the sick, raise the dead, cleanse the lepers, cast out devils. You received without charge, give without charge.'
