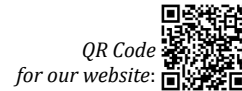

Dear friends,

In this Sunday's **Gospel Reading**, Jesus is in the midst of preaching his great mission sermon to his disciples. Already, Jesus has told his disciples what life is to be like for those who follow Jesus. And it seems as if we are now at the pointy end of things. To be a disciple, is to be single-minded in our following of the Lord. And in words that disturb us, Jesus says that we must prefer him to father or mother. We must take up our cross and follow in the footsteps of Jesus. We are to lose our life. And in this losing of our lives, we are promised that we will indeed find life. These words disturb us.

But really, they should not disturb us. For we have already died. St Paul tells us so in today's Second Reading: ***We believe that having died with Christ we shall return to life with him.*** And we have died with Christ when we were baptised in Christ Jesus. For the waters of baptism are like the tomb of Christ, and therefore, through baptism we share in the death of Jesus. We are buried under the water with him. And so when we rise from the water cleansed and renewed, we share in the rising of Jesus from the tomb on Easter Sunday. This is the heart of the mystery of Baptism: when we are baptised, we are immersed in the death and resurrection of Jesus. And so we carry with us the power of the resurrection of Christ.

This is God's hospitality towards us. We are invited to share in the life of God. We are invited to share in God's victory over sin and death. It is an invitation to share in the death, yes, of Jesus. But it is also a promise that we shall share in his rising, too. For if we have died with him, then we shall rise with him.

This is losing our life in order to find it. This is Cross and Resurrection. It is for this that we sing forever of the goodness of the Lord.

Australian Catholic Bishops Conference— Voice to Parliament

As a vote on an Indigenous Voice to Parliament nears, Australia’s bishops have encouraged Catholics to read and discuss the Uluru Statement from the Heart—the document from which the Voice proposal emerged.

During their recent plenary meeting in Sydney, the bishops considered how they might assist Catholics in preparing for the referendum to enshrine the Voice to Parliament in the Constitution, with a vote due in the second half of 2023.

The bishops argued that the fact First Nations Peoples have lived in Australia for many thousands of years but their custodianship of the land isn’t mentioned in the Constitution: *“It is an omission which needs to be rectified...a Voice to Parliament isn’t the only way to achieve that outcome, but it is the way requested by those who gathered at the historic meeting at Uluru...This could be a significant step towards a more just and equitable Australia...we want to encourage all Australians to educate themselves as well as possible concerning the proposal to establish the Voice.*

The bishops call for a meaningful debate on the issue, acknowledging that *‘people may, in good faith, have differing concerns and perspectives...we are an open democracy, and this is a moment to use our democratic institutions to produce a high-quality debate shaped by a genuine concern to do justice and bring healing to First Nations Peoples...we ask those drafting the changes to the Constitution to work together in a spirit of cooperation, so that the proposal presented to the Australian people will appeal to a wide range of the population.’*

The Australian Catholic Bishops Conference endorsed the Uluru Statement from the Heart in 2021, with the Fifth Plenary Council of Australia taking the same step last year. The bishops have encouraged us to read the document and have discussions about our response to its key messages.

First Reading: 2 Kings 4:8-11, 14-16

A reading from the second book of the Kings

That is the holy man of God, let him remain there.

One day as Elisha was on his way to Shunem, a woman of rank who lived there pressed him to stay and eat there. After this he always broke his journey for a meal when he passed that way. She said to her husband, 'Look, I am sure the man who is constantly passing our way must be a holy man of God. Let us build him a small room on the roof, and put him a bed in it, and a table and chair and lamp; whenever he comes to us he can rest there.'

One day when he came, he retired to the upper room and lay down. 'What can be done for her?' he asked. Gehazi (his servant) answered, 'Well, she has no son and her husband is old.' Elisha said, 'Call her.' The servant called her and she stood at the door. 'This time next year,' Elisha said 'you will hold a son in your arms.'

Second Reading: Romans 6:3-4, 8-11

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Romans

Having been buried with him through baptism, we shall walk in a new life.

When we were baptised in Christ Jesus we were baptised in his death; in other words, when we were baptised we went into the tomb with him and joined him in death, so that as Christ was raised from the dead by the Father's glory, we too might live a new life.

But we believe that having died with Christ we shall return to life with him: Christ, as we know, having been raised from the dead will never die again. Death has no power over him any more. When he died, he died, once

for all, to sin, so his life now is life with God; and in that way, you too must consider yourselves to be dead to sin but alive for God in Christ Jesus.

You are a chosen race, a royal priesthood,
a holy people.

Praise God who called you out of darkness
and into his marvellous light.

Gospel: Matthew 10:37-42

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew

Anyone who does not accept his cross is not worthy of me. Anyone who welcomes you, welcomes me.

Jesus instructed the Twelve as follows: 'Anyone who prefers father or mother to me is not worthy of me. Anyone who prefers son or daughter to me is not worthy of me. Anyone who does not take his cross and follow in my footsteps is not worthy of me. Anyone who finds his life will lose it; anyone who loses his life for my sake will find it.

'Anyone who welcomes you welcomes me; and those who welcome me welcome the one who sent me.

'Anyone who welcomes a prophet because he is a prophet will have a prophet's reward; and anyone who welcomes a holy man because he is a holy man will have a holy man's reward.

'If anyone gives so much as a cup of cold water to one of these little ones because he is a disciple, then I tell you solemnly, he will most certainly not lose his reward.'
