Dear friends,

For many weeks now in our Sunday Gospel readings, we have learnt about the Kingdom which Jesus brings. And it is a different sort of kingdom. For certainly, some of the people who first heard Jesus expected that the Kingdom of God would come about through a devastating military conquest. A mighty messiah who would conquer the enemy and drive out the occupying enemy. Now, this does happen when Jesus comes. But this messiah rides a donkey, and his weapons are peace and love. The enemy he conquers is death, and it is sin which is driven out.

And in today's Gospel, Jesus tells us something truly astounding about this Kingdom. Because for the people who listened to Jesus, to be the subject of a kingdom, any kingdom, meant carrying heavy burdens. It was hard work and little freedom if you were poor and weak.

But in the Kingdom which Jesus preaches, Jesus himself offers to carry our load for us. When we find that the going is just too tough, he invites us to come to him and find rest. And so, we find ourselves freed from the burden. And thus rested, we find that we are able to carry the burden of Jesus, whose yoke is easy and whose burden is light. And this is why this Kingdom is just so different. Because the wisdom of this Kingdom goes against the so-called wisdom of this world. The mystery of this Kingdom which Jesus preaches is understood by children, yet hidden from the learned and wise.

But as unusual as it is, it is this same Kingdom that we are invited to become a part. It is this Kingdom that we are called to proclaim. It is in this Kingdom where we will find our true home.

Australian Catholic Bishops Conference— Voice to Parliament

As a vote on an Indigenous Voice to Parliament nears, Australia's bishops have encouraged Catholics to read and discuss the Uluru Statement from the Heart—the document from which the Voice proposal emerged.

During their recent plenary meeting in Sydney, the bishops considered how they might assist Catholics in preparing for the referendum to enshrine the Voice to Parliament in the Constitution, with a vote due in the second half of 2023.

The bishops argued that the fact First Nations Peoples have lived in Australia for many thousands of years but their custodianship of the land isn't mentioned in the Constitution: "It is an omission which needs to be rectified...a Voice to Parliament isn't the only way to achieve that outcome, but it is the way requested by those who gathered at the historic meeting at Uluru...This could be a significant step towards a more just and equitable Australia...we want to encourage all Australians to educate themselves as well as possible concerning the proposal to establish the Voice.

The bishops call for a meaningful debate on the issue, acknowledging that 'people may, in good faith, have differing concerns and perspectives...we are an open democracy, and this is a moment to use our democratic institutions to produce a high-quality debate shaped by a genuine concern to do justice and bring healing to First Nations Peoples...we ask those drafting the changes to the Constitution to work together in a spirit of cooperation, so that the proposal presented to the Australian people will appeal to a wide range of the population.'

The Australian Catholic Bishops Conference endorsed the Uluru Statement from the Heart in 2021, with the Fifth Plenary Council of Australia taking the same step last year. The bishops have encouraged us to read the document and have discussions about our response to its key messages.
