Dear friends,

As we have followed the course of Matthew's Gospel over the last several Sundays, we have been taken on a grand journey. We have heard Jesus teaching his disciples in parables to teach them about the Kingdom of God. We have heard that the Kingdom of God is like seed scattered and sown, it is darnel and wheat sown together, it is hidden treasure, it is the pearl of great price, it is the dragnet which brings in a haul of all kinds. And then Jesus walks towards the disciples across the water in the midst of the storm. In all of this, Jesus has been leading his disciples to a particular moment. Jesus has taught his disciples something about the Kingdom of God. Then in the feeding of the Five Thousand and the Walking across the Water, Jesus has taught his disciples something about *himself*. Now, it's time! Jesus asks his disciples the question: *Who do you say I am?*

It is a time of reckoning for the disciples. They have learnt something about the Kingdom of God. They have learnt something about Jesus. Now they are asked for *their* commitment. They are asked to confess their faith in the *One* whom they have followed. And just as Peter was the one a few weeks ago who faltered in his faith as he walked across the water towards Jesus, today he is the one who stands as the spokesman for the disciples (and for us) and confesses his faith in Jesus: *You are the Christ, the Son of the Living God!*

To our ears, it doesn't sound like much. But for a Jewish fisherman from the First Century, this was a radical turn around. For Peter to confess that Jesus was the Christ: the anointed one sent by God was one thing. To confess that Jesus was the Son of the Living God was another thing altogether. For the faith of the Jews was that there was but **one** God. To confess that Jesus is the Son of God is to confess that Jesus **is** God. And this is what is so astounding about this whole episode. There is a radical turn around

here and Peter names this for us. Jesus *does* teach us something *new* and *radical* about God. Jesus *does* proclaim that God is not distant and uninterested in our world. Jesus proclaims that God has broken into our world, and is *so interested in us* that he takes on our human flesh. The response of faith with which Peter responds is the rock on which our Church is built. Faith in Jesus as the Christ, the Son of the Living God.

Like the disciples, **we too**, have heard Jesus teaching us about the Kingdom of God. Like the disciples, **we too** have learnt something about Jesus in the Feeding of Five Thousand and the Walking on the Water. Like the disciples, **we too** are asked the question: **Who do you say that I am?** What will your answer be?

Australian Catholic Bishops Conference— **Voice to Parliament**

As a vote on an Indigenous Voice to Parliament nears, Australia's bishops have encouraged Catholics to read and discuss the Uluru Statement from the Heart-the document from which the Voice proposal emerged.

During their recent plenary meeting in Sydney, the bishops considered how they might assist Catholics in preparing for the referendum to enshrine the Voice to Parliament in the Constitution, with a vote due in the second half of 2023.

The bishops argued that the fact First Nations Peoples have lived in Australia for many thousands of years but their custodianship of the land isn't mentioned in the Constitution: "It is an omission which needs to be rectified...a Voice to Parliament isn't the only way to achieve that outcome, but it is the way requested by those who gathered at the historic meeting at Uluru...This could be a significant step towards a more just and equitable Australia...we want to encourage all Australians to educate themselves as well as possible concerning the proposal to establish the Voice.

The bishops call for a meaningful debate on the issue, acknowledging that 'people may, in good faith, have differing concerns and perspectives...we are an open democracy, and this is a moment to use our democratic institutions to produce a highquality debate shaped by a genuine concern to do justice and bring healing to First Nations Peoples...we ask those drafting the changes to the Constitution to work together in a spirit of register: Information Meeting - Zoom cooperation, so that the proposal presented to the Australian people will appeal to a wide range of the population.'

The Australian Catholic Bishops Conference endorsed the Uluru Statement from the Heart in 2021, with the Fifth Plenary Council of Australia taking the same step last year. The bishops about our response to its key messages.
