Dear friends,

If you take one look at this Sunday's Gospel Reading, it seems as if God has made a mistake. For Jesus calls as his followers four fishermen: Simon and his brother Andrew; and James and John, the sons of Zebedee. Matthew's Gospel doesn't say if Simon and Andrew and James and John were up with the religious elite of their time. I think it is safe to say that they were not. But Jesus calls these four fishermen to follow him. And not just to follow him, but also to share in his work: to become fishers *of men and women.*

What is going on? What are we to make of this?

Perhaps the more surprising element of Sunday's Gospel is that these fishermen do indeed leave their nets and actually follow Jesus. These fishermen do not wait until they are perfect, until they have it all together before they decide to follow Jesus. They follow Jesus when he calls them.

The story of these four fishermen is also our story. We too are called by Jesus to follow him. And Jesus does not wait until we are perfect. Does not wait until we have it all together and have all the answers. If he did, Christian life would be a bit boring. God calls us in the midst of our life. Whether we are priest or religious or layperson, married or single, young or old, or whatever.

We are called to follow Jesus.

He went round the whole of Galilee teaching in their SECOND READING | 1 Corinthians 1:10:-13, 17 synagogues, proclaiming the Good News of the kingdom and I appeal to you, brothers, for the sake of our Lord Jesus Christ, to make curing all kinds of diseases and sickness among the people. up the differences between you, and instead of disagreeing among yourselves, to be united again in your belief and practice. From what Chloe's people have been telling me, my dear brothers, it is clear that there are serious differences among you. What I mean are all these slogans that you have, like: 'I am for Paul', 'I am for Apollo', 'I am for Cephas', 'I am for Christ'. Has Christ been parcelled out? Was it Paul that was crucified for you? Were you baptised in the name of Paul?

For Christ did not send me to baptise, but to preach the Good News, and not to preach that in the terms of philosophy in which the crucifixion of Christ cannot be expressed.
