Dear friends,

This Sunday, we read one of the more famous passages in all f Sacred Scripture: for, in the Gospel Reading we have just heard, Jesus speaks the words of the Beatitudes. When Jesus spoke these words to the crowds who were listening to him, he was giving them a charter for a new way of living. He was telling them that happiness or blessedness in this world does not equal greatness in the Kingdom of God. Power and wealth and "being first" do not really matter. Rather, true happiness lies in qualities such as gentleness, mercy, purity, and making peace.

Sounds strange doesn't it? But, remember, it is a charter for the new way of living. A way of living that is radical and yet simple.

To live a life characterised by the Beatitudes goes against much of the so-called wisdom of our world. We are called and challenged to be a people who are known by the qualities of gentleness, mercy, and making peace. Pure in heart; hungry and thirsty for what is right. To let go of all that might give us power and prestige in this world, and to live the life of radical simplicity which is outlined for us in the Beatitudes. To live this life is to know our place of humility before the greatness of God.

show those who are everything. The human race has nothing to boast about to God, but you, God has made members of Christ Jesus and by God's doing he has become our wisdom, and our virtue, and our holiness, and our freedom. As scripture says: if anyone wants to boast, let him boast about the Lord.
