Dear friends.

Following the example of the Old Testament, Christian tradition gives a very important place to Moses. Moses remains the prophet *par excellence*. The man chosen from among all the people to transmit the Word of God and the Law of God to the People of God. He carries an authority received from God. Any prophet whom God will raise up after Moses will have a similar mission and must be listened to in the same way.

The Christian reading and understanding of the Book of Deuteronomy is clear. *Jesus* is the new prophet. Raised up by God, Jesus is the new Moses, with authority from God. This is what we see in today's *Gospel Reading*. Following the call of the four fishermen last week, today we read on in Mark's Gospel. Jesus and his followers reach as far as Capernaum, and Jesus goes to the synagogue and begins to preach. *And his teaching made a deep impression on them because, unlike the scribes, he taught them with authority*.

I think it is perhaps difficult for us to imagine what the coming of Jesus to the scene was like for the people of First Century Palestine. Itinerant, healing preachers abounded. Jesus was certainly not the only prophet who went about the countryside teaching and healing.

What makes Jesus different though, is that *unlike the scribes, he taught them with authority*. The authority of a *new Moses*. An authority which comes from on high. Here, certainly, was something that was new. The challenge for those who listened to Jesus for the first time was how they would respond.

A similar challenge is presented to us. How do we respond to the Lord's call? How will you respond to the call of Jesus this year? We will need to change and adapt to new circumstances. We need to be different. As much as these opportunities are exciting, the journey ahead might be a bit daunting, too. Change and growth and development means being open to change. And change can be frightening. Often it is uncertain and unsettling.

But in the midst of all of the uncertainty and change, we are called to hear with fresh ears the challenge of the Gospel. To respond to these new situations and challenges with charity and honesty towards our brothers and sisters, but most importantly, with faith and trust in the Risen Lord. Because with faith and trust in the Risen Lord, whose witnesses we are called to be, we cannot fail. God's promise to remain true to us never fails. Our God is the God of steadfast and faithful love, who loves us as his very own. As the Psalmist reminds us: *he is our God and we the people who belong to his pasture, the flock that is led by his hand.*

Readings at Mass

First Reading: Deuteronomy 18:15-20

A reading from the book of Deuteronomy

I will put my words into the prophet's mouth, and he will tell them all I command.

Moses said to the people: 'Your God will raise up for you a prophet like myself, from among yourselves, from your own brothers; to him you must listen. This is what you yourselves asked of the Lord your God at Horeb on the day of the Assembly. "Do not let me hear again" you said "the voice of the Lord my God, nor look any longer on this great fire, or I shall die"; and the Lord said to me, "All they have spoken is well said. I will raise up a prophet like yourself for them from their own brothers; I will put my words into his mouth and he shall tell them all I command him. The man who does not listen to my words that he speaks in my name, shall be held answerable to me for it. But the prophet who presumes to say in my name a thing I have not commanded him to say, or who speaks in the name of other gods, that prophet shall die."'

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 7:32-35

A reading from the first letter of St Paul to the Corinthians

The unmarried woman dedicates herself to the things of the Lord, that she might be holy.

I would like to see you free from all worry. An

unmarried man can devote himself to the Lord's affairs, all he need worry about is pleasing the Lord; but a married man has to bother about the world's affairs and devote himself to pleasing his wife: he is torn two ways. In the same way an unmarried woman, like a young girl, can devote herself to the Lord's affairs; all she need worry about is being holy in body and spirit. The married woman, on the other hand, has to worry about the world's affairs and devote herself to pleasing her husband. I say this only to help you, not to put a halter round your necks, but simply to make sure that everything is as it should be, and that you give your undivided attention to the Lord.

A people in darkness have seen a great light: a radiant dawn shines on those lost in death. Alleluia!

Gospel: Mark 1:21-28

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark

This is a new kind of teaching that speaks with authority.

Jesus and his followers went as far as Capernaum, and as soon as the Sabbath came Jesus went to the synagogue and began to teach. And his teaching made a deep impression on them because, unlike the scribes, he taught them with authority.

In their synagogue just then there was a man possessed by an unclean spirit, and it shouted, 'What do you want with us, Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us? I know who you are: the Holy One of God.' But Jesus said sharply, 'Be quiet! Come out of him!' And the unclean spirit threw the man into convulsions and with a loud cry went out of him. The people were so astonished that they started asking each other what it all meant. 'Here is a teaching that is new' they said 'and with authority behind it: he gives orders even to unclean spirits and they obey him.' And his reputation rapidly spread everywhere, through all the surrounding Galilean countryside.
