Dear friends,

This Sunday, we celebrate the Feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord. This feast finds its origin in the Gospel accounts of a most unusual occurrence. While taking Peter, James and John with him to pray, suddenly Jesus is changed, transformed, transfigured before their eyes. His clothes become as white as the light, and he is seen talking to Moses and Elijah. And the voice of God is heard: *This is my Son, the Beloved...He enjoys my favour...Listen to Him*.

Some scholars have understood these Gospel passages as in fact *resurrection* appearances of Jesus placed before the passion of Jesus. Perhaps to give the apostles some fresh courage in the face of coming persecution and trial. I am not sure that it really matters.

In the Transfiguration, we see the glory of God revealed in Christ, the Chosen One, the Son of God. And that he is seen talking to Moses and Elijah means that this Christ, this one who is transfigured into his heavenly glory, is the *fulfillment* of the Law and the Prophets.

But as so often is the case, this feast is not something static, not something at which we are simply spectators. We see the glory of God in the Transfiguration because we too, are invited to share God's glory. We are invited to share in the glory of God in the Transfiguration. Because the one who is transfigured is the one who is truly God and truly human. And so the story of Jesus becomes our story, too. Just as Jesus is transfigured, so too, this is our destiny. To share in the glory of God. To hear the voice of God: *You are my sons and daughters, my beloved ones, who enjoy my favour!*

Australian Catholic Bishops Conference— **Voice to Parliament**

As a vote on an Indigenous Voice to Parliament nears, Australia's bishops have encouraged Catholics to read and discuss the Uluru Statement from the Heart-the document from which the Voice proposal emerged.

During their recent plenary meeting in Sydney, the bishops considered how they might assist Catholics in preparing for the referendum to enshrine the Voice to Parliament in the Constitution, with a vote due in the second half of 2023.

The bishops argued that the fact First Nations Peoples have lived in Australia for many thousands of years but their custodianship of the land isn't mentioned in the Constitution: "It is an omission which needs to be rectified...a Voice to Parliament isn't the only way to achieve that outcome, but it is the way requested by those who gathered at the historic meeting at Uluru...This could be a significant step towards a more just and equitable Australia...we want to encourage all Australians to educate themselves as well as possible concerning the proposal to establish the Voice.

The bishops call for a meaningful debate on the issue, acknowledging that 'people may, in good faith, have differing concerns and perspectives...we are an open democracy, and this more details. is a moment to use our democratic institutions to produce a highquality debate shaped by a genuine concern to do justice and bring healing to First Nations Peoples...we ask those drafting the changes to the Constitution to work together in a spirit of cooperation, so that the proposal presented to the Australian people will appeal to a wide range of the population.'

The Australian Catholic Bishops Conference endorsed the Uluru Statement from the Heart in 2021, with the Fifth Plenary Council of Australia taking the same step last year. The bishops have encouraged us to read the document and have discussions about our response to its key messages.

The Transfiguration of the Lord —6th August 2023

First Reading: Daniel 7:9-10, 13-14

A reading from the book of Daniel

His raiment was as white as snow.

As I watched:

Thrones were set in place and one of great age took his seat. His robe was white as snow, the hair of his head as pure as wool. His throne was a blaze of flames. its wheels were a burning fire. A stream of fire poured out, issuing from his presence. A thousand thousand waited on him, ten thousand times ten thousand stood before

A court was held and the books were opened. I gazed into the visions of the night. And I saw, coming on the clouds of heaven, one like a son of man. He came to the one of great age and was led into his presence. On him was conferred sovereignty, glory and kingship, and men of all peoples, nations and languages became his servants. His sovereignty is an eternal sovereignty which shall never pass away, nor will his empire ever be destroyed.

He was honoured and glorified by God the Father, when the Sublime Glory itself spoke to him and said, 'This is my Son, the Beloved; he enjoys my favour.' We heard this ourselves, spoken from heaven, when we were with him on the holy mountain.

So we have confirmation of what was said in prophecies; and you will be right to depend on prophecy and take it as a lamp for lighting a way through the dark until the dawn comes and the morning star rises in your minds.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew

There in their presence he was transfigured: his face shone like the sun and his clothes became as white as the light. Suddenly Moses and Elijah appeared to them; they were talking with him. Then Peter spoke to Jesus. 'Lord,' he said 'it is wonderful for us to be here; if vou wish. I will make three tents here, one for vou, one for Moses and one for Elijah.' He was still speaking when suddenly a bright cloud covered them with shadow, and from the cloud there came a voice which said, 'This is my Son, the Beloved; he enjoys my favour. Listen to him.' When they heard this, the disciples fell on their faces, overcome with fear. But Jesus came up and touched them. 'Stand up,' he said 'do not be afraid.' And when they raised their eyes they saw no one but only Jesus. As they came down from the mountain Jesus gave them this order, 'Tell no one about the vision until the Son of

Man has risen from the dead.'
